- 5. Teach them something

When we prioritize our students' social-emotional health, academic learning will come.

Being Heumann: An Unrepentant Memoir of a Disability Rights Activist



The Inclusive Book Club hosted weekly by Karen Killeen decided to read this

book about Judith Heumann's fight for disability rights in the US. I am so glad they did! Not only do we learn about the struggle to be seen as a human being and the fight for inclusion in society, we also see what it means to be a woman leading the charge and the obstacles she faced in being an activist.

The obstacles started early when she was placed in a separate school for people with disabilities and was not provided an education. Essentially she was hidden from society and no one expected much from her. Judith and her family fought hard to get her the education she so rightly deserved. At university she was not allowed to pursue her dream of teaching as there were no teachers who were



wheelchair users. She fought to get her credentials as a teacher and ultimately succeeded, however no school would hire her, citing safety concerns.

Judith tells her story of fighting to get the American Disability Act signed by holding protests and epic sit-ins. She talks about the everyday struggles to be seen as a human, whether it is getting on an inaccessible bus (no lifts) or finding an accessible bathroom in the White House. Her story is one of determination, grit and resilience. She offers hope for the next wave of activists and reminds us all that our rights can so easily be stripped away if we don't continue to fight for our rights and the rights of others.

Crip Camp: A Disability Revolution

Inclusion, Empowerment, Dignity, Acceptance, Awareness, the power of connecting voices, hearts and minds to what is right, just and an end to isolation and discrimination. Such were the thoughts running through my soul as I watched this inspirational documentary with tears rolling down my cheeks. Watching Crip Camp allowed me to fully embrace my disability and become an even stronger advocate for my students and for myself.

Crip Camp highlights experiences at Camp Jened,in the Catskills, where disabled teenagers were able to relish previously denied but rightly deserved



freedom and inclusion. Winner of the Documentary Award at Sundance 2020, nominated for Best Documentary Feature at the 2020 Oscars, and directed by Nicole Newnham and Jim LeBrecht, a camp attendee, this is indeed a captivative and emotional work of art that served as the impetus for the Disability Rights movement. 
